Peace must be established on the basis of humanity's moral and intellectual solidarity. T4P aims to build a strong platform for UNESCO's work on building positive peace through Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 16 through a multi-stakeholder regional dialogue on a peaceful and sustainable future in Asia and the Pacific.
